Notes of the meeting of the Council held
at Forge Cottage on Tuesday, 8th January.

A. HIGHWAY MATTERS

- 1) It was evident that in really heavy rainfall the drainage system of the lay-by outside The New Bothy & Lynchette House was not adequate and the only satisfactory answer was to build a new soakaway. The Clerk (Tony Vaughan) was asked to write to the KCC urging that this be done.
- 2) Nothing had yet been done about the overhanging hedges in Lynsted Lane. It was agreed that the KCC be pressed to use all their powers in this matter to get the work done.
- 3) The KCC had reported that the project to improve the corner at Bogle was proceeding slowly as they had met some snags regarding ownership of the land to be acquired.
- 4) The cleanliness of Greenstreet which looked as if it had not been cleaned for years was of considerable concern to members & the Clerk was asked to write to the KCC to find out if anything could be done soon.

B. PLANNING APPROVALS

C. OLD PEOPLE'S DWELLINGS

The Clerk had received a reply from the Housing Officer to his request for forms for the would-be applicants for any old people's dwellings built in Lynsted. Although before the Council investigated how many people would like such dwellings, the Borough had said there was only one applicant from Lynsted on their list (& had indeed used this as an argument against building bungalows in Lynsted), the Housing Officer in his rather off-hand reply had now intimated that some of those listed were known to want a transfer. He had, however, not sent the forms as requested & the Clerk was asked to write and insist that he do so.

D. BUS MATTERS

Re-arrangement of the bus services showed another slight deterioration of service for Lynsted but of particular worry to members was the re-timing of buses from Sittingbourne in the afternoon. There was no bus scheduled between 2.29pm and 4.40pm and as the children mostly came out of school around 3.30pm this would present them with rather a long wait - unacceptable in inclement weather. At present there was a bus mainly for the schoolchildren leaving Sittingbourne at 3.50pm The Clerk was asked to write to the Bus Company and ask that a special relief continue to be put on at about this time.

E. AGE CONCERN

Belle Friday reported on the progress made. 18 people were now attending the monthly foot clinic every month. The shopping trip to Faversham every Friday had been a tremendous success. It cost 50p for the return trip and any senior citizen who had not yet taken advantage of it and would like to should contact Belle Friday (Teynham 521134) or Ada Harwood (Teynham 521035). The mobile gentleman's hairdresser cutting the hair of those who can't get out (at 40p a time) was also being kept busy. Belle says she would like to hear from people who could help with occasional transport when needed.

F. FOOTPATHS

The Swale Footpaths Group had agreed to deal with the overgrown footpath between Cellar Hill & "Cambridge" which the Council referred to them after the last meeting.

G. LIGHTING

It was agreed that the Lighting Committee should meet to review the lighting in the parish & make recommendations as to how it could be improved either by changing the lamps or adding additional lights.

H. OTHER MATTERS

- 1) It was agreed to precept for £1400 for 1980-81 which, as a penny rate in Lynsted raised £772, would mean a parish rate of about 2p in the pound.
- 2) The Clerk reported that he was meeting a chap from the KCC regarding the costs of fixing the proposed seat in Lynsted Lane. In view of the reservations of some members regarding the type of seat currently in use in Greenstreet he would also seek his advice on the type of seat we should install.
- 3) Belle Friday reported on the work of the School Managers with especial reference to the effect the "cuts" would have. The Friends of Lynsted School hoped to provide funds to obviate the effect of some of these cuts.
- 4) Owing to the extensive coverage of Lynsted Parish Council matters (including council & parish meetings and the recent elections) since they last made a contribution in May 1978 - the equivalent of some 29 pages - the Council agreed to make a contribution of £20 towards the expenses of the NEWS LETTER.
- 5) A request had been received from residents in Ludgate Lane for a nameplate. This matter was referred to the Borough Council who were responsible for the naming of streets.
- 6) The next meeting on 10th March would be held at the Vicarage after the Annual Parish meeting which would commence at 7.30 pm. Owing to the poor attendance last year it was agreed that there would be no point in having it at the School again.

WINEMAKING AT HOME

The recipe this month is for BARLEY WINE

Ingredients:- 1lb Barley; 1lb Potatoes; 1lb raisins or ½ pt grape concentrate; 3½lb Sugar; 2 lemons; yeast & yeast nutrient; 1 gallon hot water.

MethodSTERILISE ALL EQUIPMENT

Scrub (or peel) & chop potatoes

Soak grain overnight in a pint of water

Grind barley & raisins in a mincer

Put sugar, barley, potatoes & raisins in bucket
pour on hot water

Add juice of lemons

Cool until tepid

Add yeast & yeast nutrient

Stand for 10 days, stirring daily, keeping covered

Strain & pour into fermentation jar, fit trap

Siphon into bottles when clear and fermentation
has finished

Store for 6 months.

This is difficult to judge, but everything is costing more - and there is no doubt that it is going to be increasingly difficult to replace sets of books & expensive equipment. At least the children are becoming aware of the meaning of "economy" and "taking care of what you've got".
